Who We Are: The Rocky Mountain Biological Laboratory (RMBL) was founded in 1928 on the ruins of the mining town of Gothic, Colorado. Dr. John C. Johnson, a biology professor at Western State College, recognized the rare and rich ecology of the remote high valley and along with his wife, Vera Adams Johnson, founded RMBL. In the early 1990's, RMBL initiated the science and environmental education program to provide summer science education opportunities for kindergarten through high school students.

Application Rules and Requirements:

1. Application for scholarship needs to be submitted by May 1, 2019.
2. Scholarship is to support tuition assistance.
3. Application is not a guarantee that a scholarship will be awarded.
4. Register online, select alternative payment plan. The amount of scholarship will be deducted from the total tuition due; payment plans are available for the remainder. Please note that generally up to ½ of the tuition cost is covered by an awarded scholarship. RMBL has a limited number of scholarships available for youth programs.

- Single parent
- Special needs, physical, cognitive, social and emotional and medical
- Cultural diversity
